

See a wide range of real and replica Tudor artefacts and discover how these objects provide rich details of life in Tudor times.

Voices on Victorians



Discover how Victoria's reign changed life in Britain and around the world in ways we can still see today.

Nearly 200 years ago, a little girl was born into the British Royal family. At the age of 18 she took the throne of Great Britain and oversaw one of the most dramatic changes in its history – the Industrial Revolution. In this session, discover more about the changes of Victoria's reign, the rise of steam power and the many ways in which it revolutionised life in Britain and around the world.

Hear the incredible true stories of WW2, some of which are so sensational and strange they could almost be from pages in a novel.

In this session, discover the war years of the 1940s, both at home and abroad. Delve deeper into the underworld of Second World War spies and see how the war fought in the shadows was every bit as important as that fought on the frontlines.

Welcome and Introduction

Meet the archaeologist you will be speaking to and find out more about them and their archaeological background.

A Short Talk

This talk will focus on archaeology in general or on a specific history topic. It will include a presentation on the chosen subject, pictures of key archaeological sites and a look at a range of artefacts relating to the period of interest.

Q&A

Students can ask questions about the topic they are studying or about archaeology in general. It is advisable for younger children to think of questions they would like to ask prior to the online session.
